A family centered program to assist children with disabilities, 2½ to 5½ years of age, be fully included in family life, community and school.



Family Centered

Families participate, learn, and are central in decision making

A daily program to meet the unique needs of each child and family is created.

Parents gain knowledge and understanding of their child's development.

Parent - child interaction strategies are supported to enhance development.

Parents acquire new skills and confidence to advocate for their child and family.

Parents are active members of the learning team along with:

- ⇨ Developmental Specialist (providing one to one support)
- ⇨ Occupational Therapist
- ⇨ Physical Therapist
- ⇨ Speech Language Pathologist
